Protective equipment





Appropriate engineering controls	Provide adequate ventilation. Good general ventilation should be adequate to control worker exposure to airborne contaminants. Personal, workplace environment or biological monitoring may be required to determine the effectiveness of the ventilation or other control measures and/or the necessity to use respiratory protective equipment. Use process enclosures, local exhaust ventilation or other engineering controls as the primary means to minimise worker exposure. 13.1. Waste treatment method	ds
General information	The generation of waste should be minimised or avoided wherever possible. Reuse or recycle products wherever possible.
